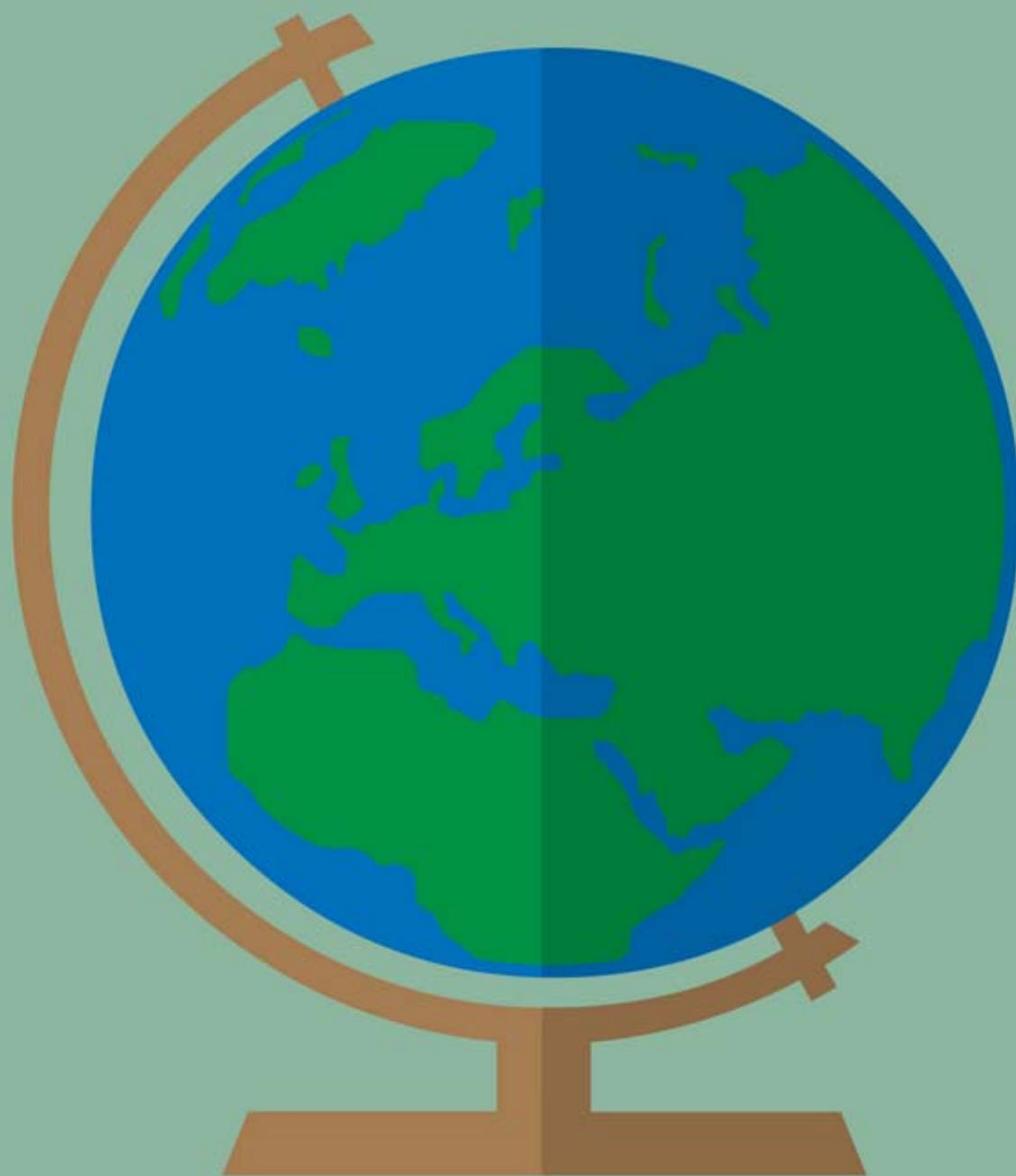

## An Update on CLEIMUN17 Preparations

Dear MUNers,

We extend a hearty welcome to “any and all” MUNers thinking about joining us at CLEIMUN17 and hope you will enjoy reading this edition of *The Plain Delegate*, and the future editions yet to come.

The past few months have seen much activity by your CLEIMUN17 Secretariat as we have gotten down to planning the conference. First, we put together our Secretariat team of Committee Chairs. We are pleased to confirm that this is a really positive group of experienced MUNers from a diverse range of MUN Schools across North East Ohio. Each committee works with the “team of three approach”, with the Security Council and General Assembly each operating with a President and Deputy President. Further along in these pages you will meet them all! Other members of the Secretariat include our Head of Press, our Website Manager and our Admin and Security Coordinator. Guiding us with strategic direction and overall management is the CLEIMUN17 Board of Control, headed up by Mr. Michael Perrins (Director, CLEIMUN17) and supported by Joint Deputy Directors Mrs. Jessica Hilty and Mr. Charlie Polinko, as well as numerous other teaching faculty from partner schools and staff from the Cleveland Council on World Affairs.

Once we had decided on our conference theme – **“International Partnership for Global Advancement”** – we set about the process of agreeing on appropriate agenda topics for our committees. This involved each committee chairing team developing agenda topic options before presenting these to the Secretariat as a whole for discussion and cross-referencing. This ensured that there was both chair “ownership” and a sensible mix of topics across all of the committees. The teams then worked on putting together the comprehensive set of Research Reports on each topic – which we know are invaluable tools for delegates as they develop understanding of the subject areas and prepare to write resolutions. Numerous workshops were held over the Summer, including chairing training sessions and we are now increasingly confident that our chairing team will be prepared and ready for CLEIMUN17.

We remind you that CLEIMUN17 is an exciting new concept in the “MUNiverse” in that our procedures combine both the “THIMUN-style” (used in Europe) with the “Harvard-style” (used in North America) systems of running MUN Conferences – thus creating a unique experience. Our pricing structure – at just \$50 per participant for a three day event (including lunches) makes us a really affordable event whilst our venue in Downtown Cleveland is also spot on! We encourage you to join us by registering for CLEIMUN17 accordingly and look forward to welcoming you to our conference.

# CLEIMUN17 Committee Topics

Over the summer, members of the CLEIMUN17 Secretariat worked together to develop the topics for each committee. Below are the topics for each CLEIMUN17 committee. Research Reports will become available online soon!

## **Security Council (SC):**

- I. Hostility towards UN peacekeeping operations such as UN Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in Mali (possible reform of current UN peace-keeping protocol)
- II. The situation in the Democratic Republic of the Congo
- III. The situation in the Western Sahara and Reform of the MINURSO staff

## **Disarmament Committee (DISEC):**

- I. Addressing the illicit weapons trade to non-state actor organizations
- II. Securing and disposing of confiscated weaponry in post-war conflict areas
- III. Further supporting efforts to discover and dismantle unidentified landmines across the globe

## **Ecological and Environmental Committee (E&E):**

- I. The question of balancing sustainable resource extraction with economic development
- II. The question of expanding and improving urban farming as a means of ending global hunger
- III. The question of expanding access to natural gas, coal, and oil to foster growth in developing nations

### **Economic and Social Committee (ECOSOC):**

- I. The question of the improvement of infrastructural development of sustainable human settlements in refugee and war torn areas
- II. The question of promoting education in post conflict situations
- III. The question of the prevention of food wastage through improved infrastructure, logistics, and supply chains in developing countries

### **Human Rights Committee (HR):**

- I. The question of woman having the rights to contraceptives and how to improve its safe and legal accessibility
- II. The question of how to stop the spread of HIV and AIDS globally and how to monitor its spread, while respecting a person's and country's right to privacy
- III. The question of the treatment and rights, which were adopted during the during the Third Geneva Convention, of prisoners of war (POWs) throughout the world and the legality surrounding the use of torture by governments and other belligerents for the purpose of gaining intelligence

### **Political Committee (POL):**

- I. The question of improving cooperation between international intelligence agencies operating globally and their effect on national sovereignty
- II. The question of establishing jurisdiction over refugees with suspected ties to terrorists
- III. The question of the reunification of the Republic of Cyprus and the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus
- IV. The question of resolving territorial claims in the South China sea



## Meet Charlie Giganti - Vice-President of the General Assembly



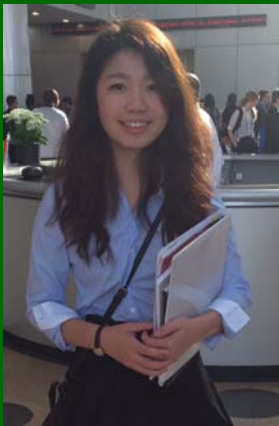
Charlie Giganti
